THREE IS A MAGIC NUMBER

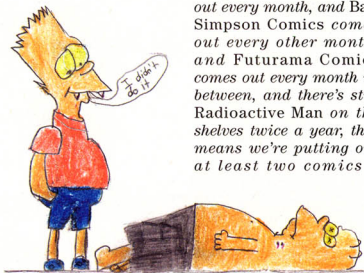
